### Serengeti Girls Run

Runners of all fitness levels are invited to this all-women event, which aims to raise funds for [Grumeti Fund's](#) empowerment programmes for girls in rural Tanzania. Comprising three consecutive 21-kilometre runs across the teeming plains of the Grumeti Reserve, it offers a unique experience of this incredible ecosystem.

Participants will also have the opportunity to engage with local girls and conservationists, to learn about their lives and the Grumeti Fund's regional community and conservation projects. This includes attending a career fair for local high school girls and an option to visit the region's Anti-Poaching Canine Unit, as well as the Centre for Research and Innovation for the Serengeti Ecosystem (RISE).

Evenings will be spent in good company, on game drives and dining under the stars at Sabora, connecting, reflecting, and slowing down.

## Sabora

An elevated bush experience, Sabora is completely open, with only canvas between you and the wilderness. Wildlife roams freely through the camp, grazing the same paths you walk, and everything is circular – from the entrance that welcomes you in, to the firepit and communal spaces – quietly drawing people together.

Calming and neutral, the camp blends easily into its surroundings. Clean lines and earth tones create a restful space to reflect. Art and décor from the region gently ground you in the space, before the bush takes over again: zebra calling, lions rumbling, birdsong carried through grass and breeze. Comfort is always close, but adventure sits at the edge of your deck.

Comprising nine self-contained tents, each with a private meditation deck and an outdoor sala with daybeds overlooking one of two watering holes, Sabora is a close-to-nature sanctuary centred around connection. Drift between the plunge pool, fitness area, and bar-deli. As night falls, gather to reflect and share stories around the fire, merging with the rhythm of the camp – intimate, elegant, and warm.

## SUPPORT

### Girls Empowerment Programmes

Your contribution will help fund the following initiatives for local girls:

- Scholarships and training programmes for local students and training programmes for Tanzanian women interested in conservation.
- Empowerment events for 5,000 high school girls.
- An 18-month supply of reusable sanitary pads for 5,000 high school girls.
- Empowerment and education sessions.
- Accommodation and meal costs during internships.
- A mentorship programme.
- Life-skills training.

### Impact

These initiatives have made a positive difference in the lives of many young girls. Easier access to sanitary pads means more hours are spent in school, positively impacting pass rates.

There has also been a greater awareness around issues of sensitive cultural practices, such as Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and early marriages, giving young girls the opportunity to make different choices for their lives. Scholarship distribution is more balanced between sexes (1:1) and girls are excelling not only in academics but also advancing to higher education.

Another major mindset shift is that boys are actively supporting the girls' empowerment agenda. This collaboration is fostering a more inclusive and harmonious environment where everyone has a chance at a brighter future.

- Total girls who have participated in girls' empowerment sessions from 2017 to 2024: 13,400 +.
- Total girls who have received reusable sanitary pads: 12,700 +.
- Total boys who participated in sessions of Girls Empowerment Through Boys since 2021: 6,300 +.
- Total girls and boys reached through empowerment sessions to date: 13,800 +.


