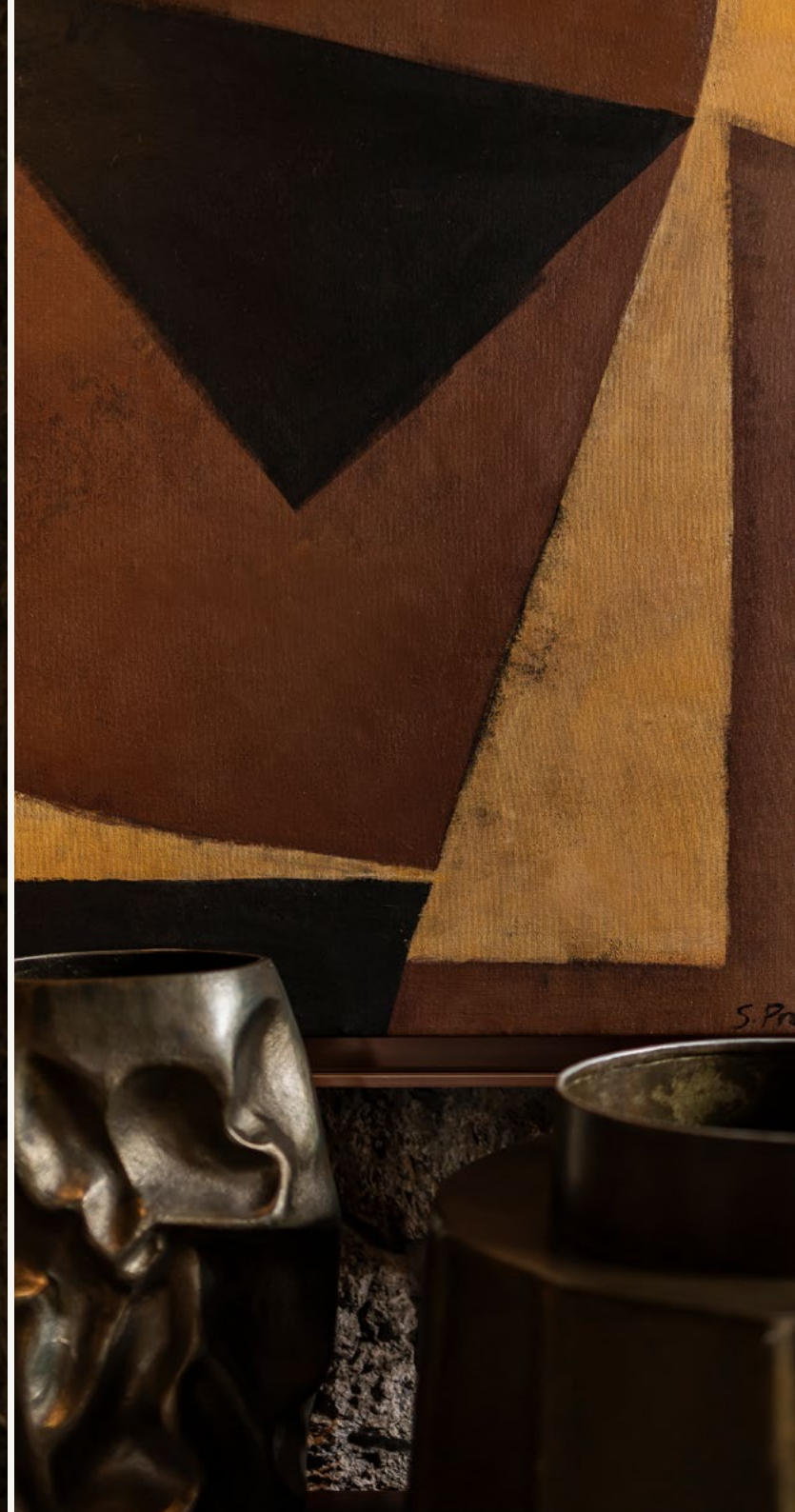




Kataza House

Walls of umber wood and volcanic stone hold you, framing views of grassland, forest, and the volcanoes beyond. Deep sofas and long tables draw you together, while each room keeps its own quiet corner for reflection. Forest presses in on every side. Water drips and flows, birdsong threads through the low calls of passing wildlife, calm settles into everything. Tall glass windows and wide sliding doors pull in the fire's warmth or let the mountain air run cool through the room. 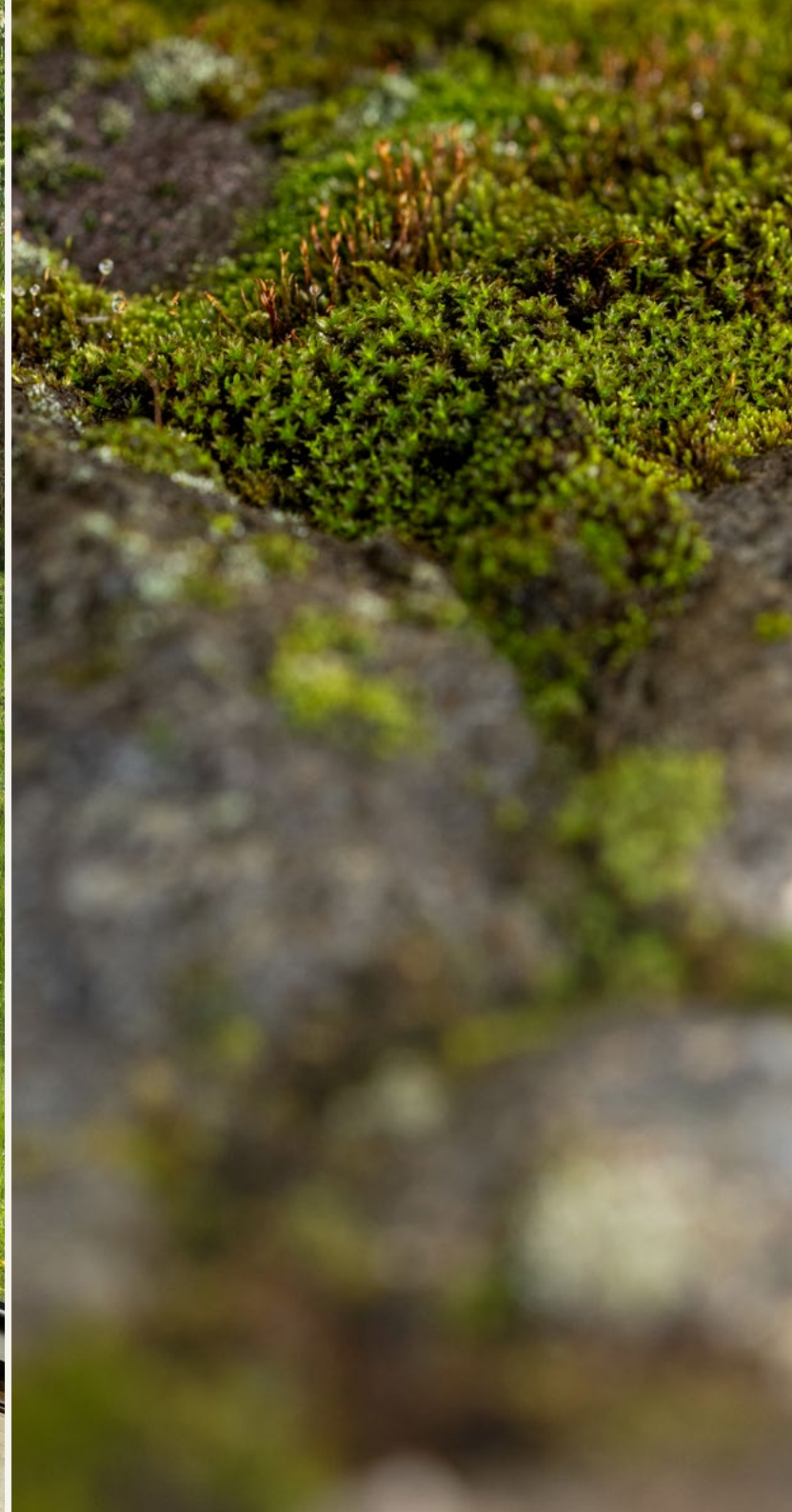

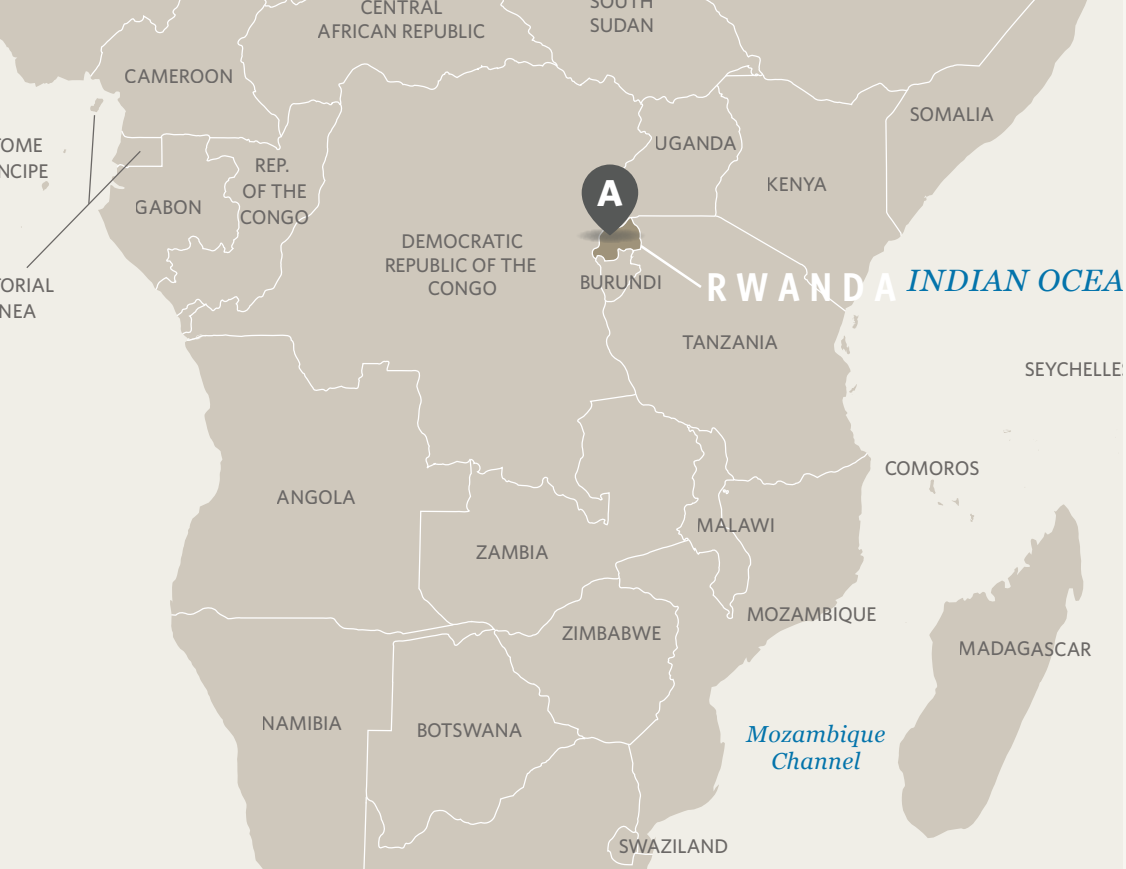

COMMUNITY & CONSERVATION EXPERIENCES

Walks across the property trace the rewilding efforts underway here, bringing you closer to the wildlife that has made this land home again. Gorilla and golden monkey treks take you further, into the forest itself, to observe the region's endemic residents up close. Community visits offer a different kind of encounter, uncovering Rwandan culture and traditions or cooking alongside students at the Singita Community Culinary School. At the Ellen DeGeneres Campus of the [Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund](#) and the Karisoke Research Center beyond it, you can learn about Dian Fossey's research, the history of gorilla conservation in the region, and the ongoing efforts underway to protect these gentle giants





Our location

SINGITA VOLCANOES NATIONAL PARK (A)

In the remote northwest of Rwanda, jagged volcanic peaks rise over a thick blanket of tropical rainforest, shrouded in mist and dripping with humidity. Amongst the trees, along the slopes, and in the farmland around these Virunga mountains, life abounds.

Volcanoes National Park is one of the most biodiverse landscapes on Earth — home to endangered mountain gorillas and golden monkeys, buffaloes and an abundance of bird species, as well as vibrant communities that have formed part of this ecosystem for generations.

KATAZA HOUSE (B)

Set against the backdrop of the Sabyinyo, Gahinga, and Muhabura volcanoes, Kataza House is built from volcanic rock, river stone, handmade ceramic tiles, and oven-red clay bricks made by surrounding communities — materials that root its warm, comforting spaces in the landscape and its culture.

GETTING THERE

International flights arrive at Rwanda's capital city, Kigali. From there, you can travel to Singita Volcanoes National Park either on a 30-minute helicopter flight or a road transfer across the verdant, undulating landscape that gives the country its nickname: the land of a thousand hills. Road transfers can take up to four hours.
